#### Aim Statements

An aim statement is a written, measurable and time-sensitive statement of the expected results in an improvement process.

Aim statements are written in a SMART format, meaning they should be specific, measurable, attainable, relevant and time bound.


- Example
   SMART Aim Statement: By 2030, we will reduce deaths, hospitalizations, and emergency department visits resulting from a motor vehicle crash in which the victim was an occupant of a vehicle and between the ages of 0 and 14 by 3% in [State].
- **SMART Goal:** By December 2026, increase by 80 % the number of organizations/agencies providing proactive child passenger safety information statewide.
- **Drivers/Change Idea:** PD2, SD1, CI 5: Include prompts for health care providers and social service professionals in paper or electronic health records, for children ages 0 through 14, to give anticipatory guidance on child passenger safety
- **Measure:** M3: Number of health care organizations that give anticipatory guidance to caregivers on child passenger safety
- Target Goal: Increase the number of healthcare organizations providing anticipatory guidance from 100 to 200 in Hampden County and from 50 to 150 in Bristol County, with priority given to organizations in locations with child passenger injury and fatality disparities.
