

Application and Statement of Commitment Cohort 2: May 2025-October 2026

Purpose: The Children's Safety Network, in cooperation with the Health Resources and Services Administration's (HRSA) Maternal and Child Health Bureau (MCHB), is launching Cohort 2 of the Child Safety Learning Collaborative to reduce fatal and serious injuries among infants, children, and adolescents.

Who may apply: Title V State/Jurisdiction Health Departments are eligible and encouraged to apply for this opportunity. The application and statement of commitment must be signed by the state/jurisdiction Maternal and Child Health Director and the Injury and Violence Prevention Director

If you are not funded through Title V, but wish to participate, please reach out to your state Health Department to find out how you can collaborate with them to participate. Timeline: Each of the cohorts over the 5-year period will last 18 months. Teams are encouraged to continue on into successive cohorts. **This new cohort will run from May 2025 to October 2026.**

How to apply: To be considered for the Child Safety Learning Collaborative, interested states and jurisdiction Title V agencies must submit the completed application form and statement of commitment by 11:59 PM EST April 11, 2025. Responsibilities and Expectations of Learning Collaborative Leadership and Participants

Participation in the Child Safety Learning Collaborative is voluntary and not required for Title V Block grantees. States and jurisdictions will be selected for participation based on their commitment and willingness to address the following criteria:

States and jurisdictions that participate in the Learning Collaborative:

- Select at least one of the five designated topic areas. It is recommended that new states/jurisdictions choose *no more than* two topic areas. Continuing states/jurisdictions are encouraged to sustain current teams and add additional topics as appropriate.
- Establish a state/jurisdiction specific aim for their topic areas focused on the reduction of injury-related fatalities, hospitalizations, and emergency department visits. Strategy Teams are

- asked to <u>work on one to three evidence-based strategies for each topic they selected</u>. Each participating team will have access to a topic-specific Change Package that contains a menu of evidence-driven strategies and accompanying measures and guidance for data collection.
- Form a Strategy Team on each topic area selected and ensure active member engagement in the CSLC monthly activities. Team membership can develop over time and should include key staff and partners for each child safety topic area selected. Strategy Team members can come from state or jurisdiction health departments, and/or from partner organizations from the public or private sectors.
- Implement quality improvement strategies and tools
- Maintain leadership engagement throughout the cohort. Senior leaders in each state/jurisdiction are expected to guide and support the Strategy Teams. The leaders are a critical part of catalyzing, implementing, spreading, and sustaining change. This support may require regular meetings, designing a feedback structure, and providing guidance to team members.
