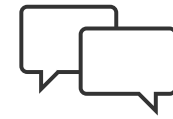

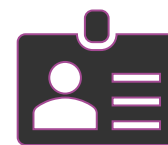

Child Safety Learning Collaborative



The aim of the CSLC is to **reduce fatal and serious injuries** among infants, children, and youth ages 0-19 by supporting **collaborative improvement** among states and jurisdictional level Title V agencies.

We do this through:

- Using a shared “all teach/all learn” model of collaborative learning
- Supporting states to use a quality improvement approach
- Addressing shared strategies to increase the potential for collective impact across CSLC states.

Eligibility

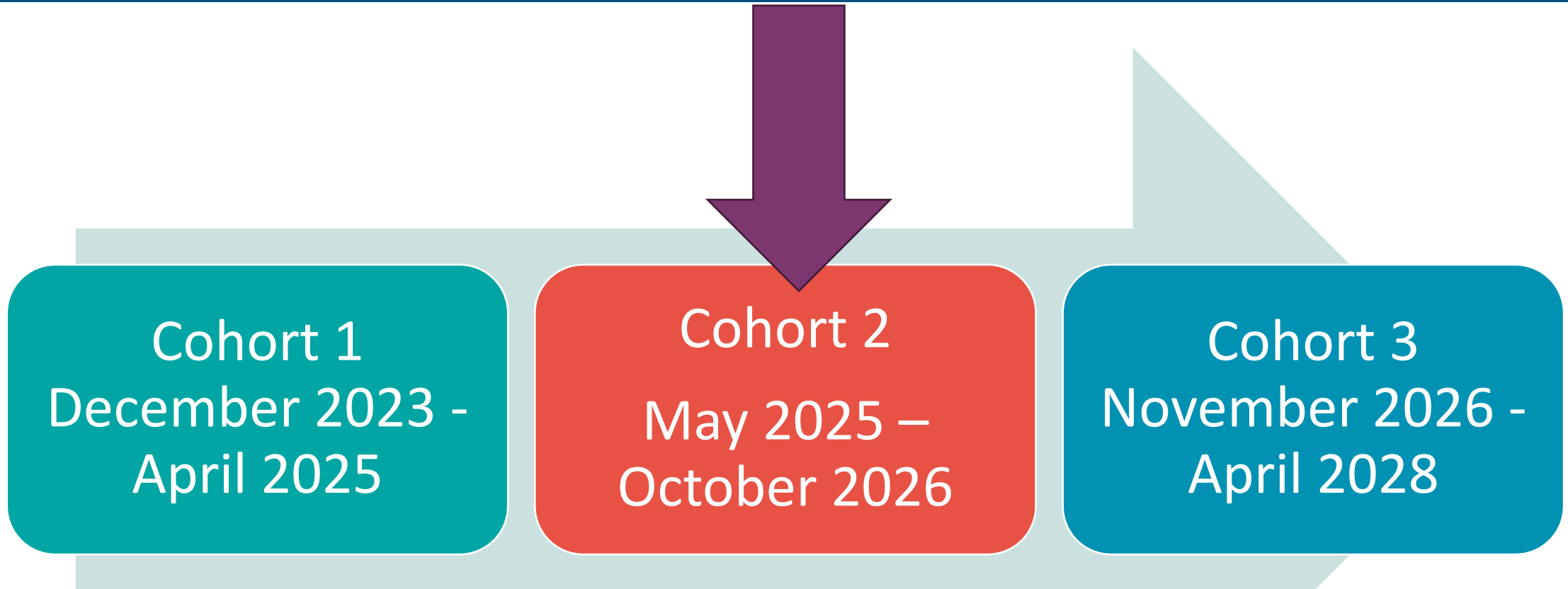
- This opportunity is for all state/jurisdiction Title V agencies

Model for Improvement



Topic Specific Change Packages

- Evidence-based and evidence-informed strategies
- Selected for greatest impact and potential for changes
- Aligns with MCHB National Performance Measures, Title V MCH goals, and state strategies
- Organized across the social-ecological model
- Process and proxy measures to help collect and measure real-time improvements

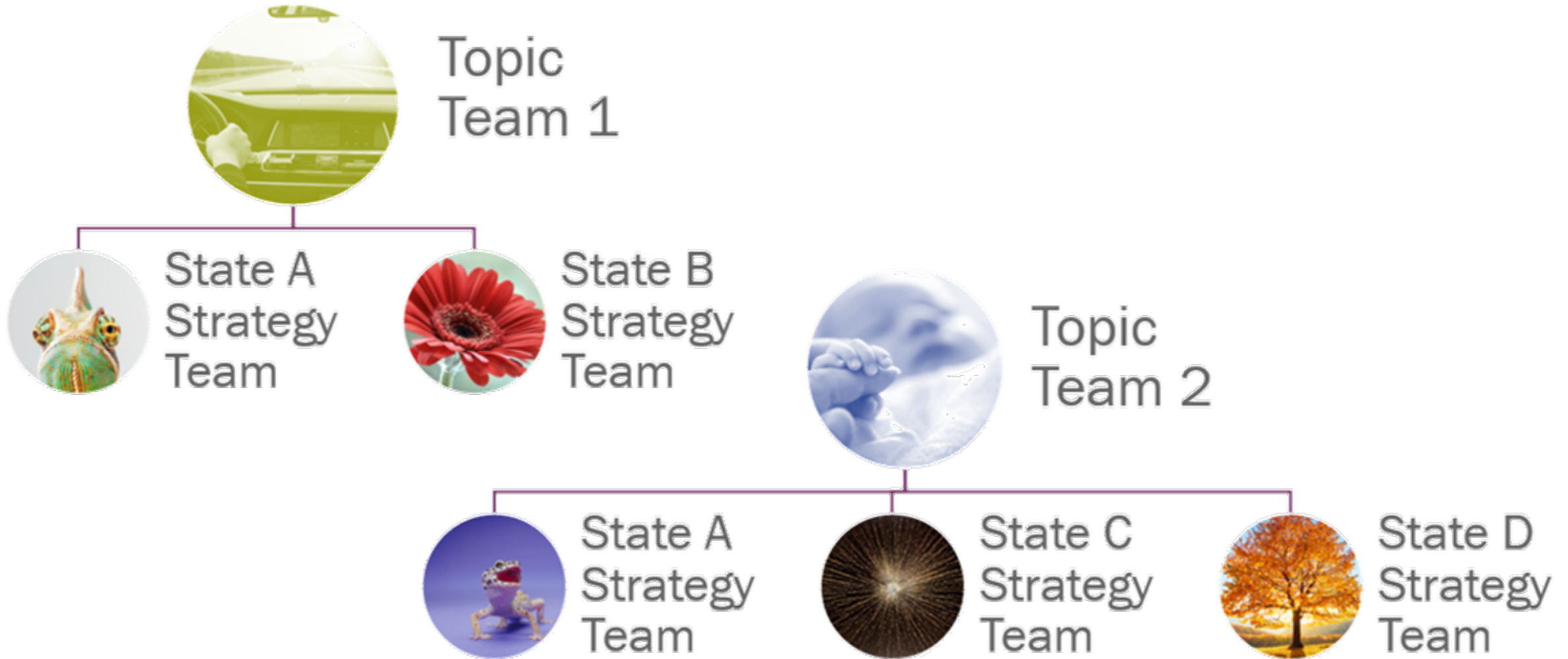


Topic Teams

- Topic team for each of the select child safety topic areas
- Comprised of all state and jurisdiction strategy teams
- Work within the topic change package for collaborative outcomes
- Led by CSLC staff member (called a co-manager)
- Provides opportunity for all teach/all learn approach

Demonstrating Collective Impact

Participation Commitments

- Identify partners and create a Strategy Team
- Select and implement 1-3 evidence-driven strategies/change ideas from the topic change package
- Utilize quality improvement methods
- Access, collect, and report real-time monthly data to contribute to collective impact measurement
- Engage in monthly online meetings and periodic learning sessions

A Closer Look: CSLC Activities and Timeline



Activity	Timing
New Member Orientation	➤ May 20, 2025 12:00-1:00p ET ➤ May 22, 2025 4:00-5:00p ET *Team members attend one
Initial Consultations	Scheduled individually with teams throughout May 2025
Topic Calls	Held every <u>other</u> month, beginning in July 2025
State Technical Assistance Webinars	Held on the alternating months from topic calls
Monthly Reporting	Requested the first week of each month
Learning Sessions	Held twice a cohort First one: Virtual - June 17 & 18 for 3 hours each day

Quality Improvement Tools

- Management and planning tools to build learning
- Tools for managing and tracking quality improvement efforts on child safety strategies
- Plan-Do-Study-Act (PDSA) Cycles: tracked and updated regularly
- Feedback and targeted technical assistance provided regularly by CSLC topic leads

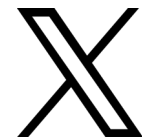
